

THE MAKUENI COUNTY FINANCE BILL, 2025

AN ACT of the County Assembly of Makueni to provide for the imposition or variation of fees, charges, licenses, rents or rates for services pursuant to Article 209 and 210 of the Constitution of Kenya 2010 and for connected purposes.

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PART I - PRELIMINARIES

Short title and commencement	1. This Act may be cited as the Makueni County Finance Act, 2025 and shall come into operation on the date of publication in the <i>Gazette</i> .
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Definitions	<p>2. In this Act unless the context otherwise requires--</p> <p>“Authorized channel” means the manner in which a person may effect payment to the County Government, including but not limited to payment to a person designated by the Executive Committee Member pursuant to Section 157 of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012, to collect and or receive revenue; or any other mode of payment as may be prescribed from time to time;</p> <p>“County” means Makueni County;</p> <p>“County Government” means the Government of Makueni County</p> <p>“County Public Officer” means a county public officer within the meaning of Section 2 of the County Governments Act, 2012;</p> <p>“County receiver of revenue” means a person designated pursuant to Section 157 of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012;</p> <p>“County Revenue Collector” means a county public officer authorized to collect revenue pursuant to Section 158 of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012;</p> <p>“Executive Committee Member” means the County Executive Committee Member for the time being responsible for matters relating to finance in the County Government;</p> <p>“Permit” means an original permit issued under this Act;</p> <p>“Person” means a natural or juristic person</p>
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PART II - FEES AND PAYMENTS

Lands, Housing and Physical planning fees	3. (1) The County Government shall offer the services specified in part 12 and 13 of the third schedule upon receipt of payment of the fee prescribed in the last column of that Schedule. In addition, the county government shall impose such fees as specified in part 1 of the first schedule.
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	<p>(2) A person who wishes to construct a building or structure in the Manner specified in the third Schedule shall apply for a Construction permit to the County Department responsible for physical planning.</p> <p>(3) A person who carries out development within the County without appropriate planning approvals shall be guilty of an Offence and shall be liable upon conviction to a fine not exceeding Fifty thousand shillings or an imprisonment term not Exceeding one year or to both such fine and imprisonment</p> <p>(4) A person occupying a plot, stall or a building leased or rented out by the County Government shall pay rent at the rate Specified in the last column of the relevant parts of the third Schedule.</p> <p>(5) The rent referred to under subsection (4) shall be due in case of-</p> <p>(a) a plot, on the 1st day of January of each year;</p> <p>(b) a house or stall on the first day of each month</p> <p>(6) A penalty of three percent compounded per month shall be charged on the outstanding rent on premises.</p> <p>(7) The County Government may evict a person who fails to pay for the premise rent for three months.</p> <p>(8) The County Government may repossess the plot referred to under sub section (4) if the person fails to pay the rent after the 31st day of March.</p> <p>“Rated value” means the value assigned to all properties in the county by the valuation roll; and</p> <p>“Valuation Roll” means the legal document consisting of property information of all ratable properties within the boundaries of Makueni County.</p>
Advertisement	<p>4. (1) A person who wishes to display advertisements and signage in the manner specified in the third Schedule shall apply for a permit to the County Government Department responsible for Physical Planning.</p> <p>(2) A person who wishes to advertise in the manner specified in the third Schedule shall apply for a permit to the County Government Department responsible for Physical Planning.</p>

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	<p>(3) The Department of Physical Planning may grant the necessary permit referred to under subsection (2) upon payment of the fees prescribed in the third Schedule.</p> <p>(4) A person who contravenes any of the provisions of this section commits an offence and shall be subjected to fines as prescribed under part 36 of the third schedule.</p>
Market Fees	<p>5. (1) There shall be a fee for access of markets or stalls for the sale of goods, foods, animals or products as specified in Part 17 and 18 of the third schedule.</p> <p>(2) A person who wishes to access the markets or the stalls for the sale of goods, foods, animals or products shall pay the fees specified in the last column of Part 17 and 18 of the third Schedule.</p> <p>(3) A person who contravenes any of the provisions of this section commits an offence and shall be subjected to fines as prescribed under part 36 of the third schedule.</p>
Hire of county Government vehicles and machinery	<p>6. (1) A person shall not use County Government machinery without the relevant authority from the County Government.</p> <p>(2) A person who wishes to use County Government machinery shall apply to the relevant department within the County Government.</p> <p>(3) The relevant County Government department may grant the application under subsection (2) upon the payment of the fee Specified in the last column of Part 11 of the third schedule</p> <p>(4) A person who contravenes the provision of this section Commits an offence and shall be liable for a fine or surcharge of twice the fee prescribed.</p>
Fees for County Stadia and Halls	<p>7. (1) A person shall not use County Stadia, grounds or hall specified in Part 23 or 24 of the third schedule without authority from the County Government.</p> <p>(2) A person who wishes to use County stadia, ground or hall specified in sub-section (1) shall apply for a permit to the relevant County Government department.</p> <p>(3) The relevant County Government department may grant the Permit referred to in subsection (2) upon payment of fees prescribed in the last column of the relevant part of that Schedule.</p> <p>(4) A person who contravenes any of the provisions of this section Commits an offence and shall be subjected to fines as outlined in part 35 of the Third schedule.</p>
Fire-fighting, related safety inspections and	<p>8. (1) A person who intends to hire the County Government facilities or to obtain from the County Government services specified in Part 31 of the Third Schedule shall pay the fee prescribed in the last column of</p>

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<p>other services</p>	<p>relevant part of that Schedule.</p> <p>(2) A person who is carrying out or intends to carry out a business within the County shall pay an annual fire safety inspection fee prescribed in the last column of Part 31 of the Third Schedule.</p> <p>(4) A person shall pay the fee prescribed in the last column of Part 31 of the Third Schedule for routine inspection which may be carried out from time to time by an authorized officer to ensure compliance with fire safety measures.</p> <p>(5) A person who requests for training by the County Government for fire safety shall pay the fee prescribed in the relevant part of Part 31 of the Third Schedule</p> <p>(6) A person who fails to pay the fee prescribed in subsection (2) after having received a service or hired an equipment or vehicle fails to pay the fee prescribed under this section contravenes the provisions of this section and shall be liable to a penalty of ten per cent of the fee chargeable.</p> <p>(7) In addition to any other remedy under this Act, a person who contravenes the provisions of this section commits an offence and on conviction is liable to a fine of a sum not exceeding Kenya Shillings fifty thousand or an imprisonment term not exceeding three months or to both</p>
<p>Impounding of animals and other goods</p>	<p>9. (1) An authorized officer may impound an animal or goods of any person for purposes of enforcing this Act or any other written law, including laws relating to environment, transport, livestock management and regulation of any trade.</p> <p>(2) An animal or goods impounded by the County Government shall be released upon payment of the fee specified in Part 18 of the Third Schedule.</p> <p>(3) Where an animal or goods impounded by the County Government is not claimed by the owner for a period of not less than six months, such animal or goods shall be disposed in accordance with the provisions of the Public Procurement and Disposal Act, 2015 and the proceeds shall be realized by the County Government.</p>
<p>Fees for weights and measures</p>	<p>10. (1) A person who uses weights, weighing machines and instruments, spirit and liquid measuring instruments in trade shall Annually apply to the County Government for their verification and pay the annual verification fee as prescribed in the last column of Part 30 of the Third Schedule.</p> <p>(2) Notwithstanding the generality of sub-section (1), a fee may be charged per service rendered, including a fee for adjusting the weights and other miscellaneous services as prescribed in the last column of Part VI of the First Schedule.</p>

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	<p>(3) A person shall not use or continue to use any weights, weighing machines and instruments, spirits and liquid measuring instruments in any trade unless the same are verified in accordance with this Act and any other relevant written law.</p> <p>(4) A person who contravenes the provision of this section commits an offence and on conviction, is liable to a fine not exceeding twenty thousand shillings or an imprisonment term not exceeding three years or to both.</p>
<p>Betting, lotteries and gaming</p>	<p>11. (1) A person shall not carry out any of the activities listed under Part VII of the First Schedule unless that person has first obtained a permit from the County Government.</p> <p>(2) The County Government shall only issue the relevant permit to an applicant who has met the requirements of the relevant written law and upon payment of the fees prescribed in the relevant section of Part 2 of the First Schedule.</p> <p>(3) A person who contravenes the provisions of this section commits an offence and on conviction, is liable to a fine of a sum not exceeding one hundred thousand or imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months or to both.</p> <p>(4) In addition to any other remedy under this Act and any other written law, an authorized officer may impound the goods of a person who is in contravention of the provisions of this section</p>
<p>Commercial Adverts, Noise Emission and Vibrations Permit</p>	<p>12. (1) An occupier or owner of any premises whether movable or immovable shall not permit commercial adverts, noise emission and vibrations unless that person has first obtained a permit from the County Government.</p> <p>(2) The County Government shall only issue the permit to the applicant upon payment of the fees prescribed in Part 3 of the Third Schedule and meeting the requirements set out under any other relevant written law.</p> <p>(3) A person who contravenes this section shall be guilty of an offence and on conviction, in addition to any other remedy under any other written law, be liable to a fine of a sum not exceeding Kenya Shillings ten thousand (Ksh. 10,000) or an imprisonment term not exceeding three months or to both.</p>
<p>Permit for base stations</p>	<p>13. (1) A person who intends to establish or has established a base station shall pay an annual base station permit fee specified in the relevant section of Part 13 of the Third Schedule.</p> <p>(2) In addition to any other remedy under any other written law, an authorized officer may impound equipment of any person who has failed</p>

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	to pay the fee prescribed under subsection (1) above
Fees for use of public cemeteries	14. Any person who intends to use a burial site at the County public cemeteries whether on a temporary or permanent basis shall first pay the fee prescribed in Part 24 of the third Schedule
Fees for use of the County bus park or picking and dropping bays	15. (1) A person who uses a County bus part or picking and dropping bays shall be charged the fee specified in the relevant section in Part 8 of the Third Schedule. (2) A public service vehicle’s Sacco or a public service vehicle registered group may apply to the County Government for reservation of a particular area, picking or dropping bay and pay the fees prescribed in Part 8 of the Third Schedule. (3) For avoidance of doubt, the reservation under subsection (2) shall not be construed to be a charge in lieu to the provisions of subsections (1) or any other relevant provisions of this Act. (4) An authorized officer may impound a vehicle or an item of any person who fails to pay the fee prescribed under this section. (5) For purposes of this section, a County Government parking attendant or any other enforcement officer of the County Government is an authorized officer. (6) A person who fails to comply with the provisions of this section shall be guilty of an offence under this Act and in addition to any other penalties as prescribed under this Act or any other relevant written law, shall be liable to pay the penalties specified in the relevant section of Part of the Third Schedule. (7) A person who contravenes any of provisions of this section shall be guilty of an offence and shall, in addition to any other remedy under any other written law, pay the penalties and fees prescribed under Part 8 of the Third Schedule.
Fees for registration of public service vehicles and booking offices	16. (1) A person who intends to operate a public service vehicle shall register the vehicle and pay the fee prescribed in the relevant section of Part I of the Third Schedule. (2) Where a person contravenes the provision of this section, the provisions of section 15 shall apply.
Fees for use of County parking areas	17. (1) A person who uses a County parking shall be charged the fee prescribed in the relevant section of Part 8 of the Third Schedule. (2) Where a person contravenes the provisions of this section, the provisions of section 15 shall apply with the relevant modifications

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Wayleave charges and rent	<p>18. (1) Any person who intends to acquire the use of a wayleave on a road reserve or such other facility of the County Government shall apply for wayleave and approval and pay to the County Government the charges and rent prescribed in Part 8 of the third Schedule.</p> <p>(2) A person who uses a wayleave in contravention of subsection (1) commits an offence and in addition to any other remedy under any other written law, the County Government may –</p> <p>(a) charge a penalty for the use of wayleave at the rate prescribed in Part VIII of the fourth schedule; or</p> <p>(b) the authorized officer may impound any equipment or infrastructure facilitating the person to use the wayleave.</p>
Food and Hygiene	<p>19. (1) A person shall not sell products, operate a business or receive the services specified in Parts 29 of the third Schedule without a permit from the County Government.</p> <p>(2) A person who wishes to sell foods or drugs or receive the County Government services specified in the third schedule shall apply for a permit from the relevant County Government Department.</p> <p>(3) The relevant County Department may grant the permit or provide the services specified in the Third Schedule upon payment of the fee specified in that schedule.</p> <p>(4) A person who contravenes any of the provisions of this section commits an offence.</p>
Livestock and veterinary services fees	<p>20. (1) A person shall not carry out any business or provide the services specified in Part 6 of the third Schedule Without the authority from the County Government.</p> <p>(2) A person who wishes to carry out a business or provide the Services specified in part 7 of the Third Schedule shall apply for a permit or certificate to the relevant County Government Department.</p> <p>(3) The relevant County Government Department may grant the Permit under subsection (2) upon payment of fees prescribed in that schedule.</p> <p>(4) A person who contravenes any of the provisions of this section commits an offence.</p>
Medical and Public Health Services	<p>21. (1) A person who receives medical or health services from health centers in the County shall be charged the fee specified in the last column of part 29 of the third Schedule;</p> <p>(2) The fees applicable to sub section (1) shall not be levied for victims of rape when filing a P3 form in a County medical facility.”</p>
Infrastructure maintenance fee	<p>22. (1) A person who operates a quarry or transports quarry products, red soil, white clay soil and others from, into or through the County shall pay the fee specified in Part 2 of the Third Schedule.</p> <p>(2) A person transporting agricultural products from, into or through the</p>

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	<p>County shall be charged the fee specified in Part, 5 and 6 of the third Schedule for the maintenance of infrastructure.</p> <p>(3) A person who contravenes provisions of this section shall be guilty of offence and shall be subjected to fines as prescribed under Part 35 of the third schedule.</p>
Tax waivers and Variations	<p>23. The Executive Committee Member may exempt, waive or vary fees or charges payable under this Act in accordance to the criteria prescribed under section 159 of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012.</p>
Amendment of Schedules	<p>24. (1) The Executive Committee Member may by order published in the Gazette amend any of the Schedules to this Act.</p> <p>(2) An order made under subsection (1) shall be laid before the County Assembly without unreasonable delay, and unless a resolution approving the order is passed by the County Assembly within the next twenty-one days on which it next sits after the order is so laid, the order shall lapse, but without prejudice to anything previously done thereunder.</p>
Payments to the County Government	<p>25. (1) All payments to the County Government shall be made through an authorized channel.</p> <p>(2) A County Government Revenue Collector or authorized officer shall in the exercise of any functions under this part identify himself or herself.</p> <p>(3) An official receipt shall be issued for all payments made to the County Government.</p> <p>(4) A person shall not receive or collect any money on behalf of the County Government unless authorized in writing by the Executive Committee Member.</p> <p>(5) A person who contravenes the provisions of this section Commits an offence</p>
Instalment Payment	<p>26. A person who operates business within Makueni County can make Instalment payment for half year permit Charged at 50% of full invoiced amount and Quarterly permit charged at 25% of full invoiced amount. Full payment of Unified Invoice amount will enjoy discounted rates of 5% for large business and 10% for small and medium business.</p>
Appointment and Duties of an Agent	<p>27. (1) In this section-</p> <p>"Agent" means a person appointed as such under subsection (2)</p> <p>"a notice" means a notice issued by the Executive Committee Member appointing an agent.</p> <p>(2) The Executive Committee Member may by written notice addressed to any person: -</p> <p>(a) appoint him or her to be an agent of the County Government for the purposes of collection or recovery of charges, permit fees, license fees, rent, cess and such other fees, as may be necessary for carrying out the purposes of this Act;</p>

	<p>(b) Specify the amount of charges, permit fees, license fees, rent, cess and such other fees to be collected or recovered by the agent.</p> <p>(3) An agent appointed under this section shall ensure due compliance with the provisions of this Act and remittal of revenue collected to the county receiver of revenue or as may be otherwise instructed in the appointment notice.</p> <p>(4) Where an agent claims to be, or to have become unable to comply with subsection (2), he or she shall, within seven working days, notify the Executive Committee Member in writing, setting out fully the reasons for his inability to comply, and the Executive Committee Member shall accept the notification and cancel or amend the appointment notice accordingly.</p> <p>(5) Where an agent fails to issue a notice to the Executive Committee Member under subsection (4), sufficient moneys for the payment of charges, permit fees, license fees, rent, cess and such other fees specified in the agent's appointment notice shall be presumed to be held by him and this money shall be due and payable to the County Government.</p> <p>(6) For the purpose of this section, the Executive Committee Member may, by notice in writing, at any time, require any person to furnish him or her, within reasonable time not being less than seven days from the date of service of the notice, with information showing any moneys which may be held by the agent for, or due by him to the County Government.</p> <p>(7) Where an agent fails to pay an amount of money collected under this section within the time specified in the notice, the provisions of this Act relating to the collection and recovery of revenue shall apply to the collection and recovery of that amount as if it were revenue due and payable by the agent, the due date for the payment of which was the date upon which that amount should have been paid to the County Government under this subsection.</p>
	<p>PART III - OFFENCES, ENFORCEMENT AND PENALTIES</p>
<p>General Penalties</p>	<p>28. (1) A person who commits an offence under this Act for which no penalty is provided shall be liable upon conviction to a fine as provided by other county laws or any other relevant laws of Kenya.</p> <p>(2) A person who hinders, obstructs, interferes or prevents an authorized officer, or any other person duly authorized in writing by the Executive Committee Member in exercising the powers under this Act shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable upon conviction to a fine of one hundred thousand shillings or to an imprisonment term not exceeding one year or to both.</p> <p>(3) A person who refuses to give information or gives false information</p>

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	<p>which may lead to under charging in addition to any other remedy under this Act shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable upon conviction to a fine not exceeding one hundred thousand shillings or to an imprisonment term not exceeding one year or to both.</p>
<p>Offences by staff of the county Government</p>	<p>29. (1) A county Public Officer or any other person having a duty to perform under this Act who –</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (a) makes in any record, or document required to be kept or made by that person, an entry which he or she knows or has reasonable cause to believe not to be true or to be false; (b) willfully refuses to do anything which he or she knows or has reasonable cause to know is required to be done; (c) interferes with any other person or process under this Act, so as to defeat the provisions, requirements or purposes of this Act; (d) where required under this Act to do anything to give effect to the provisions of this Act, fails to do such thing; (e) without reasonable cause omits to do something in breach of his or her duty under this Act; (f) willfully contravenes the provisions of this Act to give undue advantage or favor to another person; or (g) fails to prevent or report to the County Government or any other relevant authority, the commission of an offence committed under this Act; <p>Commits an offence and is liable upon conviction, to a fine not exceeding two hundred thousand shillings or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding one year, or both.</p>
<p>Cancellation of licenses and permits</p>	<p>30. (1) In addition to the offences under this Act, if any person without lawful authority-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (a) Operates illegal business which cannot be permitted by any law; (b) Transfers business premises license or permit for purposes of undertaking business in non-designated or permitted area; (c) Conducts business other than that permitted by the license; shall subject to confirmation by the Executive Committee Member, have their license or permit cancelled thereof. (d) Any license or permit which is cancelled shall, on notice being given to the holder thereof, be returned to the issuing office within seven days of the receipt of the notice, and where any holder of a cancelled license or permit fails to return the license or permit as aforesaid, he shall be guilty of an offence under this Act.
<p>Penalties</p>	<p>31. Unless otherwise stated in this Act, any person who contravenes the provisions of this Act shall be liable to a fine not exceeding five thousand shillings in respect of a first offence and not exceeding seven thousand</p>
