#### **Our Mandate**

The Department of Devolution, Public Participation, County Administration and Special Programs is mandated to handle matters concerning coordination of government and management of devolved service delivery, enforcement, public participation, civic education, Disaster management and special programs, liquor control, research, documentation and knowledge management. The department is the host for the Kenya School for Devolution and Community Led Development.

#### Partnership Achievements in the last 10 years of Devolution
