Our journey here in Makueni is not happening in isolation. It is part of a broader, global movement towards sustainable development—a movement that seeks to build a world where no one is left behind. Today, as we celebrate the progress we have made, let us reflect on how our efforts align with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

Goal 4 of the SDGs calls for inclusive and equitable quality education and the promotion of lifelong learning opportunities for all. By investing in our vocational training centers, we are ensuring that every young person in Makueni has the chance to acquire the skills they need to thrive in a competitive world. These skills are not just about securing a job; they are about creating opportunities, fostering innovation, and building sustainable communities.

Goal 8, which advocates for decent work and economic growth, is also central to our mission. Today, we see before us the fruits of our labor, this year over 900 students graduated from various Vocational Training institutions equipped with skills in masonry, motor vehicle mechanics, solar installation technology, hairdressing and beauty, fashion design, and garment making technology among others. These young professionals are not just joining the job market; they are joining it as change-makers, ready to innovate and lead.

- Allow me to share some of the significant strides we have made under my leadership and through the tireless efforts of our dedicated teams:
- 1. **Governance and Financing**: In the financial year 2023/24, we appointed 61 visionary leaders to serve as chairpersons for our Vocational Training Centers. These leaders are tasked with ensuring good governance, quality training, and sustainable development.

Additionally, in the last 2 years we have provided **Ksh. 40 million** in capitation and extended bursary support worth over **Kshs 9Million** to our needy trainees marking the first time our county has extended such support since devolution.

- 2. **Graduation of Skilled Professionals:** This year, **over 900 trainees** graduated with skills that are not only relevant but also essential for the socio-economic development of our county and our country. These skills span diverse fields such as carpentry, solar technology, fashion design, motor vehicle mechanics, and many others. We are proud of these young men and women, who are now ready to take on the challenges of the modern world.
- 3. Infrastructure Development: Our commitment to building and improving our vocational training infrastructure is unwavering. We recognize that the foundation for quality education lies in well-equipped institutions, and we are investing heavily to ensure that our centers meet the highest standards. In the last 2 years we have undertaken 25 infrastructure improvement projects spanning from (workshops, Tools & equipment, dormitories, electrification among others) worth over Kshs 68 million.
- 4. **Government Automation and Innovations** The Government of Makueni County has embraced automation as a cornerstone of our strategic plan. From the County Core Revenue Management System (ZiZi RMS) to the County Integrated Health Management Information System (CIHMIS), and from the Project Monitoring and Tracking System (PMTS) to the Vocational Training Centers (VTC) Management Information System, we are leading the way in digital governance.

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These initiatives have not only improved efficiency, accessibility, and transparency but have also reduced corruption and operational costs. They have made us a model for other counties to emulate.

A special appreciation goes to the **Department of ICT**, **Education and Internship** for their outstanding work in planning this Skills Exhibition. Your efforts in coordinating this event have not only made today possible but have also created a platform to showcase the talents of our youth and connect them to opportunities.

To our partners, stakeholders, and the residents of Makueni County, thank you for believing in our vision and for walking this journey with us. Together, we are building a county that is not just skilled but also inclusive, innovative, and ready for the future.
