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## 1.0 INTRODUCTION

Emali-Sultan Hamud Municipality was established through Emali-Sultan Hamud Municipal Charter as approved by the County Assembly in November 2022 and assented to by the Governor of Government of Makueni County in December 2022 in line with the Urban Areas and Cities Act (UACA) of 2011, amended 2019. The municipality covers an approximate area of 577KM<sup>2</sup>. It partially covers three sub-counties where Kilome accounts for 47%, Kibwezi West (33%) and Makueni (20%). With respect to wards, the Emali-Sultan Hamud Municipality covers the entire Kasikeu, Emali/Mulala and Mbitini Wards and partially Nguu/Masumba (88.52KM<sup>2</sup>) and Nzaui/Kilili/Kalamba wards.

Section 108 of the County Government act, 2012 gives opportunity for preparation of a County integrated development plan which is a five-year development plan that integrates the long-term spatial, sector and urban plans. Section 37 and 38 of the Urban Areas and Cities (Amendment) Act 2019 provides for preparation of an Integrated Development Plan (IDeP) which is a five-year development plan, outlining the projects and programs that will be carried out within Municipal jurisdiction for five years. It must be aligned to the development plans and strategies of the county governments. In addition to the above, the IDeP further provides for preparation of Annual Urban Investment Plan (AUIPs) which are guiding tools for annual implementation and review of the plans and programmes included in the IDeP.

The FY 2023/2024 Annual Investment Plan was prepared by municipal technical staff in consultation with Municipal Board taking into consideration the municipal residents development priorities identified and prioritized during public participation forum on 6<sup>th</sup> April, 2023 at Emali Town, Marikiti.


