The Ward Development Profile provides an overview of milestones achieved in County for the FY 2022/23 and FY 2023/24. It documents all programmes/projects implemented across the ward, highlighting key benefits to the citizens of Makueni County

UNIVERSAL HEALTH COVERAGE

Efforts to enhance and increase access to essential primary healthcare were achieved through: -

- Supply of essential medical commodities to all health centers across the ward to improve access to healthcare services
- Installation of gutters and water tanks at Mituvu dispensary, Kisoi Munyao dispensary, Kaseveni health center, Kyaluma health center and Waia dispensary for water harvesting and storage.



WATER ACCESS

The county Government increased water access and volumes of water harvested across Kako/waia ward through the following projects:

- Rehabilitation and distribution of water from Miua earth dam and Waia earth dam benefitting approximately 1,800 households.
- Solarization and distribution of Kyaluma borehole and Makaia boreholes benefitting approximately 800 households
- Distribution of Kwa Mutombi water project benefitting approximately 300 households.

ROAD ACCESS AND CONNECTIVITY

To enhance road network connectivity and electrification, the county government: -

- Opened 30km of road, graded 79km and gravelled 0.1km to enhance access within the ward.
- Installed drainage structures such as 80m of culverts and 40 gabion boxes which rendered the road passable during the rainy season
- Constructed Savani and Kyamangatu drifts connecting institutions and villages.
- Excavation of 13,050M of catch water mitre drains as way of transforming roads into climate resilient infrastructure.
- Connected 54 households and Kako warehouse with electricity in partnership with REREC to increase safety, security and promote green cooking.



EDUCATION ACCESS

Enhanced access to education and training through: -

- Construction of classrooms at two ECDE centers namely; Kyaume and Kilungu ECDEs, providing conducive learning environment.
- Conversion of 31 ECDE teachers to permanent and pensionable ensuring consistency access to education
- Provision of teaching and learning materials to 36 ECDE centres to enhance access to quality education
- Supporting 324 bright and needy students with bursaries in FY2023/24 and awarded full scholarships to 6 new Form One students over the past two financial years, aiming to enhance retention in learning institutions.
- Provision of capitation to three CTTIs namely; Kitandi, Nduluku and St.Patrick Kako



AGRICULTURAL VALUE CHAIN

In efforts to increase agricultural production and productivity, the county government: -

- Supplied 1.056 metric tons of certified maize seeds to 528 farmers and 1.52 metric tons of certified bean seeds to 762 farmers to cushion them the cost of purchasing farm inputs.
- Vaccinated 2,971 cattle against FMD, LSD, RVF and 7,193 against CCP benefitting 1,019 households.
- Stocked Mia Earth Dam with 2,000 fingerlings to promote aquaculture development and support local fish farming initiatives.
- Supported Angukia Youth Group with 12 beehives to promote sustainable beekeeping and honey production
- Through NARIGP program, supported farmers in mango and poultry value chains, benefitting 800 households. Excavated 20 farm ponds and constructed a sump tank at Kwanguni sand dam to improve water access for irrigation supporting 50 farmers.
- Constructed Kako warehouse, office and toilet facility at Kako to support 400 farmers, supplied 6 groups with incubators to improve poultry production and supported 50 groups in the poultry value chain by providing chicks, feeds, vaccines and water tanks under KCEP CRAL.

SOCIAL PROTECTION AND YOUTH EMPOWERMENT

The county government undertook the following interventions, to enhance social well-being and youth empowerment: -

- Supported 113 elderly individuals with food and non-food items to enhance their well-being, along with NHIF subscriptions for healthcare access, benefiting 5.1% of the ward's elderly population of 2,205.
- Establishment of Safe space engaging 173 (78 boys, 95 girls) school going children
- Supported 8 ward teams with sets of uniforms in an effort to promote sports development.
