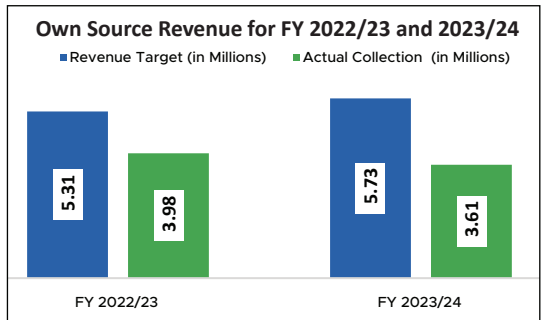
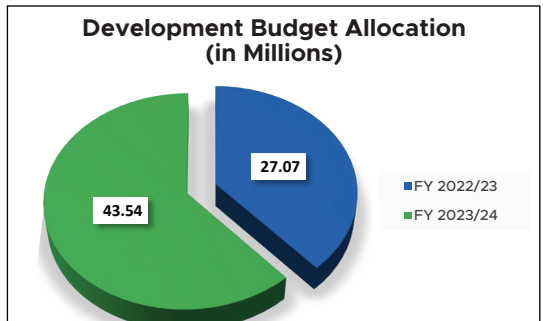
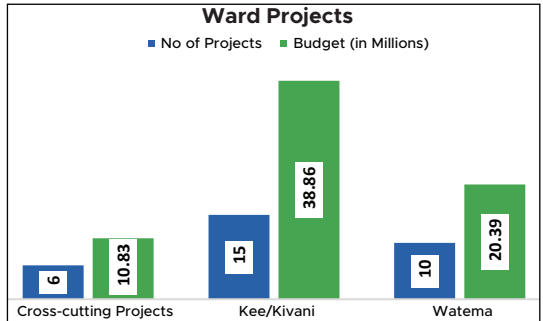

## MILESTONES



### WATER ACCESS

**The county Government increased water access and volumes of water harvested through the following interventions: -**

- Solarization and distribution of Kilia borehole with a yield of 3.5M3/hr benefitting approximately 800 households
- Solarization of Mwitiko water project benefitting approximately 600 households
- Solarization and distribution of Kyandumbi borehole which benefits approximately 500 households
- De-silting of Masaani earth dam benefitting approximately 250 households



### URBAN DEVELOPMENT AND PUBLIC SANITATION

**To boost development, the county government : -**

- Initiated the operationalization of Mbooni-kee municipality:
- Promoted public sanitation through market cleaning and waste collection initiative in 11 markets across the ward



### ROAD ACCESS AND CONNECTIVITY

**The county government enhanced road network connectivity and electrification through: -**

- Opening of 9.6km of road and grading 59km to enhance access within the ward.
- Excavation of 599m cut off mitre drains through miradi kwa jamii programme creating job opportunities to 612 community members, transforming roads into climate resilient infrastructure and improving agricultural production
- Connection of 70 households in Mavia Meu village with electricity through REREC Matching grant, improving living standards and stimulating local economic activities
- Installation of street lights at Ngiluni, Makongo, Kithuni, Watema, kasungu & kivani markets hence enhancing security, safety and extending trading hours.

## MILESTONES



### EDUCATION ACCESS

#### Enhanced access to education and training through: -

- Construction of classrooms in 2 ECDE centres, namely; Nguluni and Kivaku ECDEs, providing conducive learning environment.
- Conversion of 23 ECDE teachers to permanent and pensionable ensuring consistent access to education and improved livelihood
- Provision of teaching and learning materials to 28 ECDE centres to enhance the quality of early childhood education.
- Supporting 470 bright and needy students with bursaries in FY2023/24 and awarded full scholarships to 6 new Form One students over the past two financial years, aiming to enhance retention in learning institutions.
- Provision of training tools to Mwea and Kee CTTIs to enhance practical skills training, ensuring access to quality vocational training.



### AGRICULTURAL VALUE CHAIN

#### In efforts to increase agricultural production and productivity, the county government: -

- Supported 2,013 farmers with 12,348 avocado seedlings, fertilizer and insecticides to cushion farmers on farm input cost
- Supported the development of industrial crops through sisal promotion, benefiting 850 individuals
- Under NARIGP:
  - Promoted Disruptive Agricultural Technologies to 8 Cohorts benefiting a total of 6,500 farmers.
  - Supported poultry value chain
  - Provided support to 169 mangos farmers(6CIGs) in FY 2022/23 and 332 mangos farmers (13 CIGs) in FY 23/24.
- Supported formation of Kee ward Sacco with a grant of ksh 1 million benefiting 300 farmers
- Vaccinated a total of 3,198 livestock against CCPP & RVF diseases benefiting 812 households

## MILESTONES



### UNIVERSAL HEALTH COVERAGE

**Efforts to enhance and increase access to essential primary healthcare were achieved through: -**

- Renovation of Kee health centre outpatient block enabling conducive environment to offer primary health care to a catchment population of 1,800.
- Engagement of 80 community health promoters in carrying out primary health care reaching out to approximately 5,000 households.
- Conducted outreach campaigns which include Non-Communicable Diseases (NCDs) and medical outreach within the ward promoting primary health care



### ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION

**Environmental conservation was enhanced through:**

- Planting of 256,000 trees in Makongo and Kilala forests, as well as surrounding farms in partnership with the World Resources Institute (WRI).

### SOCIAL PROTECTION AND YOUTH EMPOWERMENT

**The county government undertook the following interventions, to enhance social well-being and youth empowerment: -**

- Supported 112 elderly individuals with food and non-food items to enhance their well-being, along with NHIF subscriptions for healthcare access, benefiting 5.4% of the ward's elderly population of 2,092.
- Organized Safe spaces forums benefitting 168 school going children
- Supported teams to participate in ward games and provided 22 teams with uniforms and balls to nurture talent and promote sports development.
- Trained 23 youth on driving courses to enhance access to driving work related opportunities
