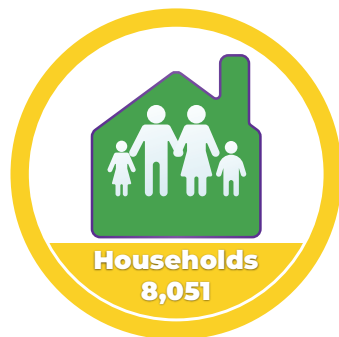

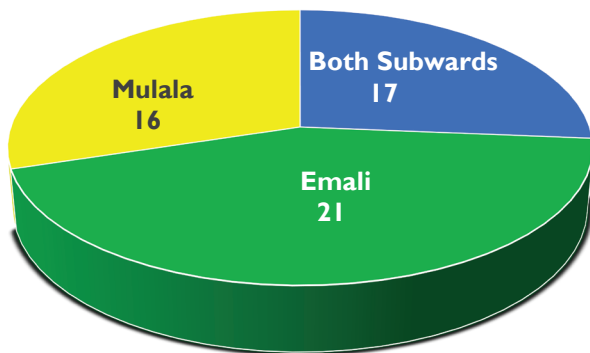
1.0 Introduction

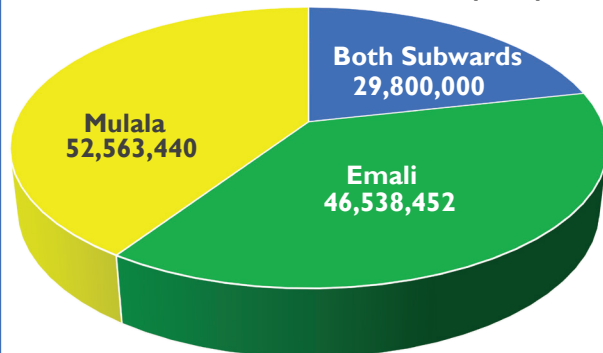

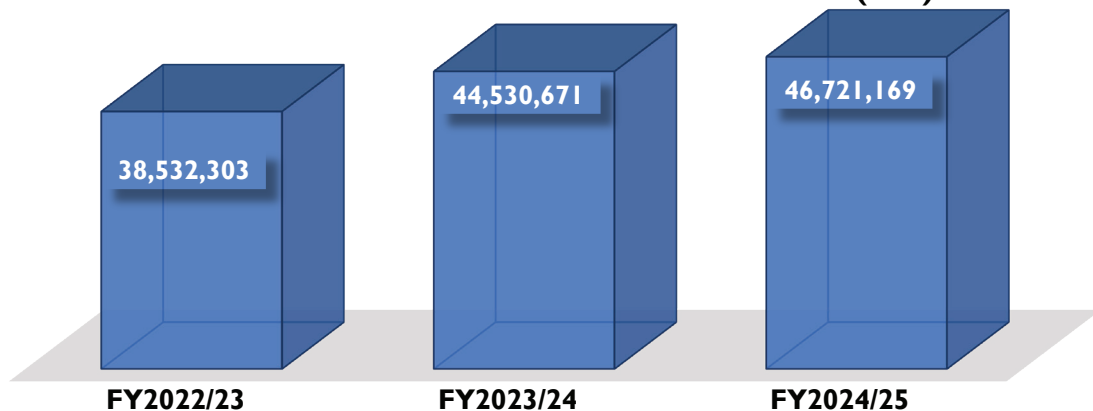
No of Projects for FY2022/23, FY2023/24 and FY2024/25

2.0 Achievements

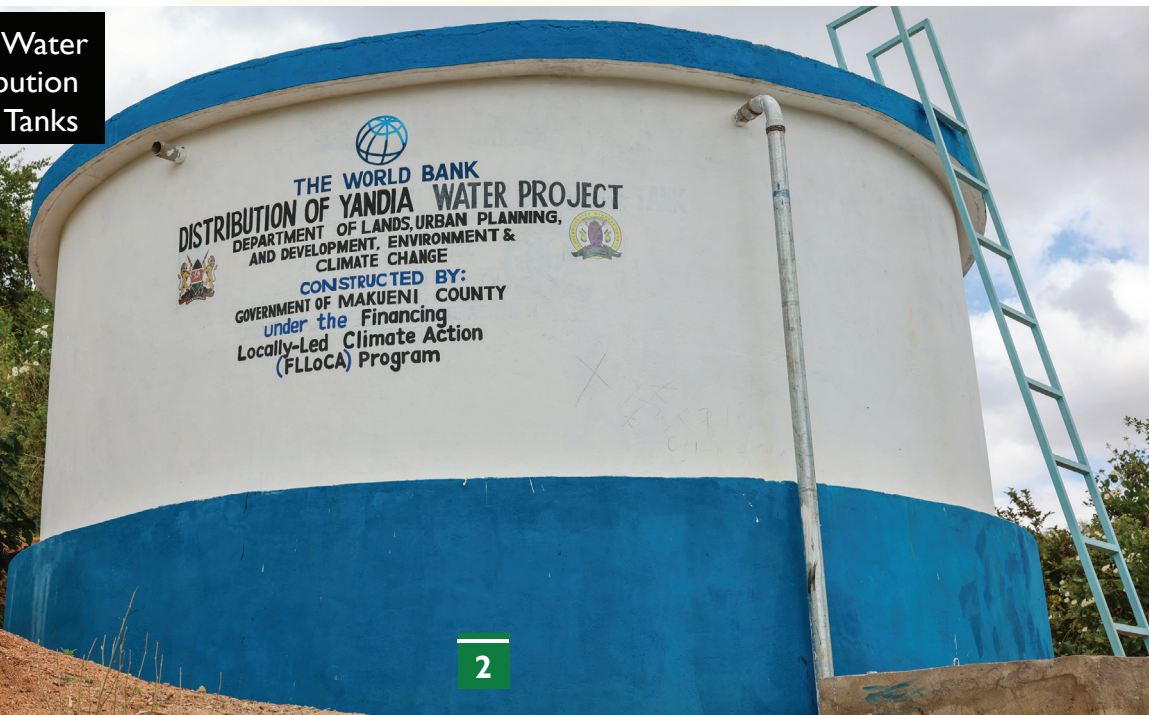


Water Access and Environmental Conservation

To enhance access and reduce distance to water sources, the county government;

- Distributed Ilengeni water springs with a pipeline extension of 13km, benefitting approximately 1,000 households in Mbitini and Emali wards.
- Drilled and equipped Emali town borehole with a yield of 3m³/h, pipeline extension of 0.4Km, serving approximately 200 households.
- Constructed Maima earth dam with a capacity of 20,000m³, serving approximately 300 households.
- Drilled and equipped Matiku borehole with a yield of 4m³/hr, 0.5Km pipeline extension, benefitting approximately 150 households.
- Rehabilitated and solarized Tutini borehole with a yield of 18m³/hr, 10km pipeline extension and 11 water points, benefitting approximately 1,000 households.
- Solarized and distributed Mumbuni sump water project, benefitting approximately 1,000 households.
- Constructed Nguasini concrete dam with a capacity of 4,000m³ benefiting approximately 200 households.
- Enhanced Yandia water project through solarization and distribution under Financing Locally-Led Climate Action program, improving access to safe and reliable water for surrounding community of approximately 600 households.

Road Access and Connectivity

To increase road accessibility and connectivity, the county government:

- Opened 17 km, graded 78.7 km, and graveled 9.5 km of roads across the ward, improving accessibility and connectivity for residents.
- Installed 128m of culverts and 65 gabion boxes, enhancing drainage and ensuring roads remained passable during the rainy season.
- Promoted conservation agriculture through the excavation of 1,750m³ of mitre drains, contributing to climate-resilient road infrastructure.
- Connected 152 households at Mbisu Mbyu and Kambiwa villages with electricity through REREC matching grant to increase reliable and safe access to electricity.
- Installed grid-powered floodlights at Mulala market to enhance security and extend trading hours.

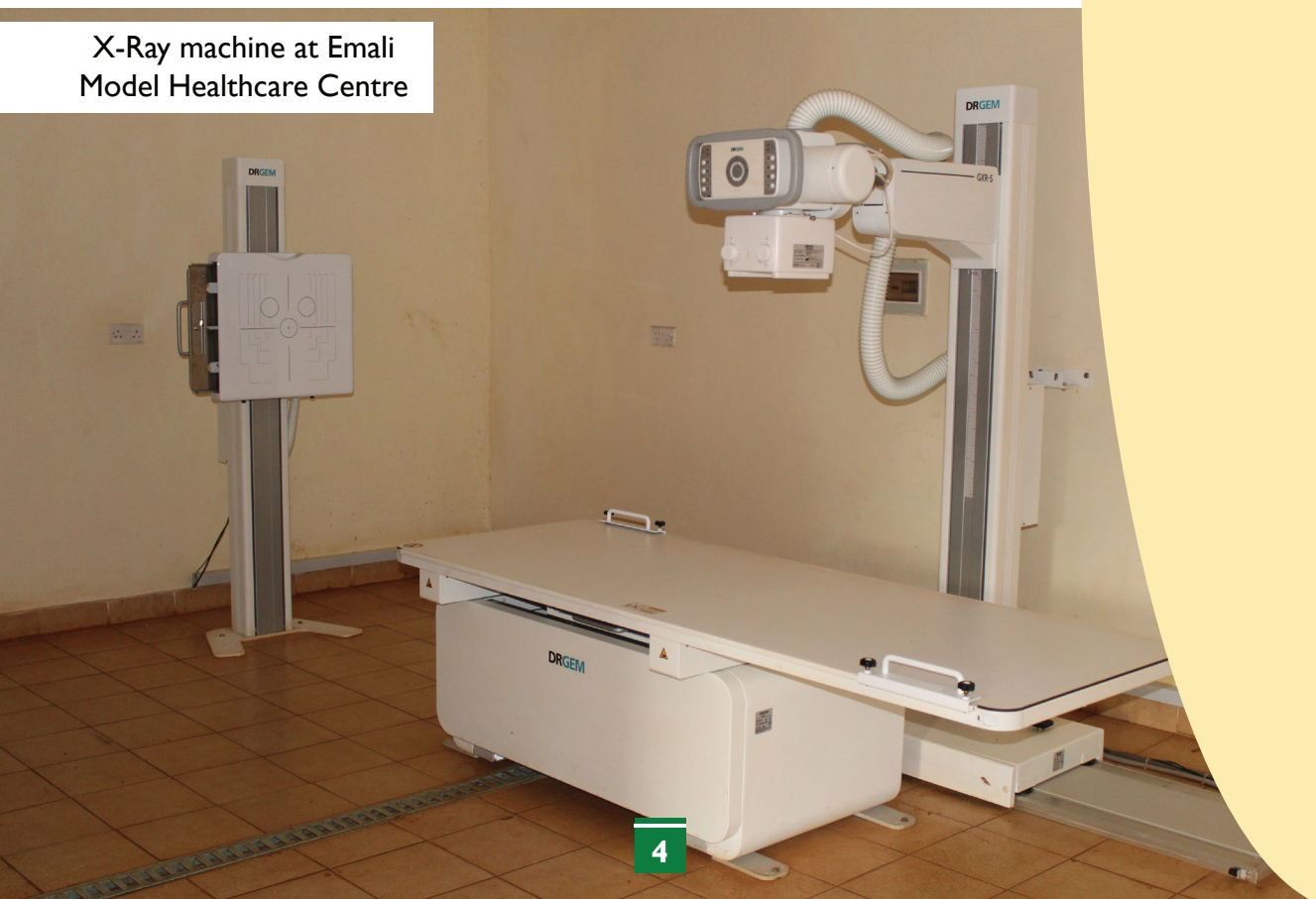


Health Services

To enhance access to healthcare, the County Government:

- Distributed essential commodities and medical supplies to various health facilities
- Constructed and equipped Emali Model Health Centre X-Ray block expected to serve more than 28,000 people along Nairobi-Mombasa highway, Makueni and Kajiado counties.
- Fenced Kwa Kotoe and Tutini dispensaries, enhancing security within the facilities.
- Conducted outreach campaigns against Non-Communicable Diseases (NCDs) and Medical outreach. The program contributed to overall reduction of maternal, infant and child mortality as well as Improved health awareness

Urban Development

To promote urban development and spur economic growth, the County Government:

- Established Emali-Sultan Hamud Municipality, with charter approved and Municipal Board appointed, enhancing decentralized service delivery.
- Opened and unclogged 4,350 meters of drainage channels in Emali and Sultan Hamud towns, and engaged 464 casual market cleaners to clean, collect, and dispose of solid waste across 28 markets within Emali-Sultan Hamud Municipality.
- Procured 4 cleaning machinery packages (tractor, trailer, bowser, and pump) to enhance sanitation services, alongside the provision of protective gear for market cleaners under Emali-Sultan Municipality.



Security of Land Tenure

To promote sustainable land use and enhance access to justice and safeguard inheritance rights, the county government:

- Developed informal settlements designs in partnership with Kenya Informal Settlement Programme (KISIP) at Soko Mjinga in Emali for 157 plots, improving tenure security for low-income residents.
- Conducted a legal clinic and succession-rights awareness campaign, benefiting 90 households and initiated the drafting and filing of 45 succession petitions.



Access to Education

To enhance access to quality education and training, the county government;

- Constructed Mwasang'ombe and Emali Township ECDE classrooms, providing a conducive learning environment for learners.
- Converted 23 ECDE teachers to permanent and pensionable terms, ensuring consistent access to education.
- Provided teaching and learning materials to 28 ECDE centres, enhancing access to quality education.
- Achieved an increase of 11.8% in ECDE enrolment, rising from 1,006 in 2022 to 1,125 in 2025, as a result of the ward's ECDE interventions.
- Constructed and equipped two twin workshops at Kwa Kakulu and Ng'etha vocational training centres.
- Supported 1,504 bright and needy students with bursaries and awarded full scholarships to 6 form one entrants, enhancing retention and transition in learning institutions.

Agricultural Production and Productivity

In efforts to enhance food security, improve farmer livelihoods and promote sustainable agricultural practices, the county government implemented the following interventions;

- Vaccinated a total of 13,899 livestock and poultry against diseases, benefiting approximately 2,596 farmers.
- Constructed five vaccination crushes, improving livestock handling, benefiting over 2,000 farmers.
- Constructed Kwa Villu earth dam with a capacity of 18,836m³ in partnership with SIVAP, benefiting over 300 households.
- Supported SACCO formation and promoted disruptive agricultural technologies through 8 cohorts under NARIG, reaching a total of 3,862 farmers.
- Facilitated 1,043 farmers to access farm inputs through the e-voucher platform under KCEP-CRAL.
- Promoted dairy value chain through subsidized AI services, benefiting 1,500 farmers.
- Facilitated the formation of ward-based SACCO and awarded inclusion grants of Ksh 1,000,000 to support farmers in saving and accessing credit.
- Constructed an apiary house and supplied 10 Langstroth beehives, protective harvesting gear, and a honey extractor, supporting apiculture-based income generation under FLLoCA.
- Established a ¼-acre climate-smart agriculture (CSA) demonstration farm, distributed 100kg of pasture seed, and provided 100 kitchen garden units (50 vertical sacks and 50 conical gardens), enhancing household food security and sustainable land use under FLoCCA.
- Conducted training on CSA practices, pasture establishment, and apiculture to strengthen community resilience to climate change and improve livelihoods under FLoCCA.



Social Protection and Youth Empowerment

To improve the well-being and livelihood of the vulnerable population, the county government;

- Supported 14 organized groups with business start-up items for economic empowerment (Tents and chairs to 10 groups and PA systems to 4 groups).
- Issued assorted assistive mobility devices to 22 persons with disabilities, promoting self-reliance.
- Supplied aprons to 237 mechanics to enhance occupational safety and hygiene.
- Supported 113 elderly individuals with food and non-food items to enhance their well-being, along with medical insurance subscriptions for healthcare access, benefiting 7.8% of the ward's elderly population of 1,452.
- Engaged 144 (54 boys and 90 girls) under the safe spaces programme to identify key protection concerns for targeted follow-up and intervention.
- Facilitated 32 ward teams to participate in Ligi Mashinani ward leagues and provided sports items promoting sports development at grassroot level.
- Developed Kiuni playground, providing a space for nurturing talents in sporting activities.
- Upgraded Makueni Child Rescue Centre with Infrastructural development, solar lighting and deployment of a centre manager for operationalization



Governance

To strengthen governance, coordination, citizen engagement, overall service delivery and citizen participation at the ward level, the government;

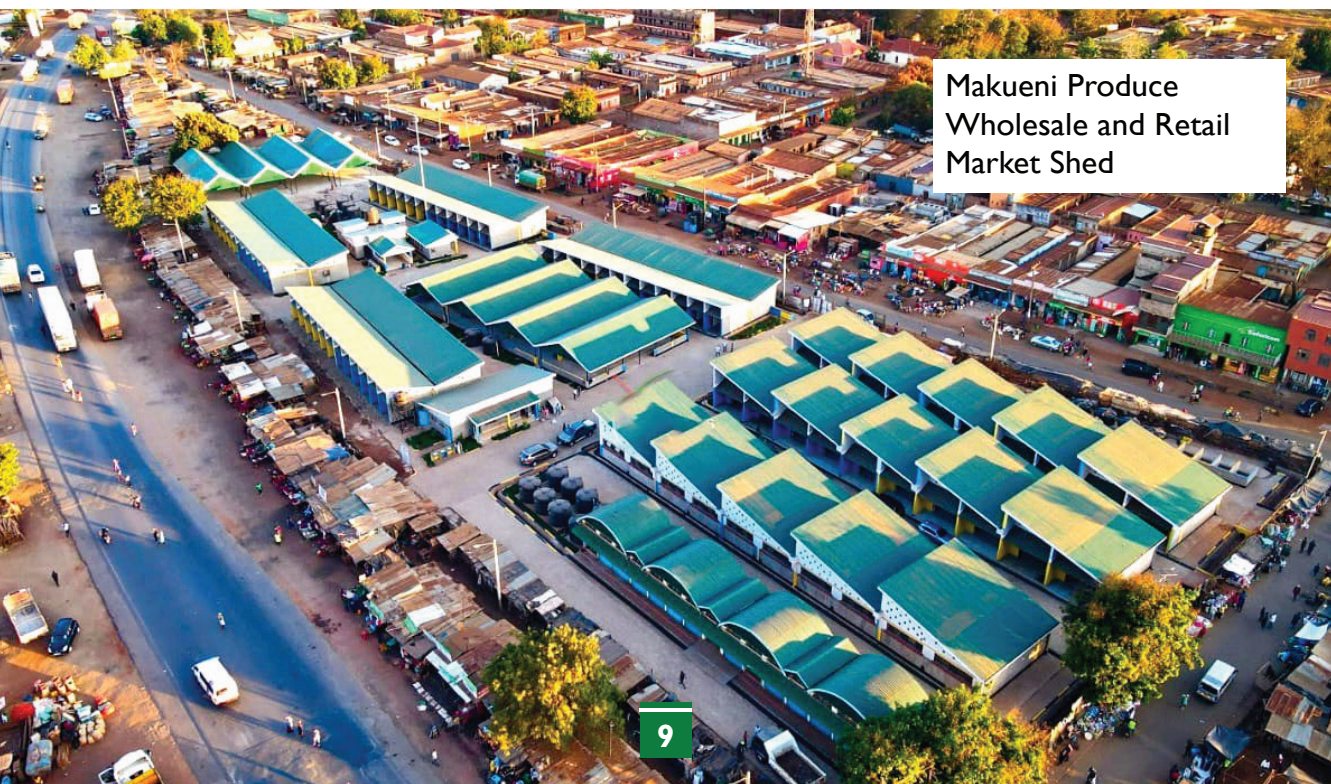
- Facilitated the election of development committees at village, cluster, sub-ward, and ward levels.
- Established and operationalized 55 market coordination committees.



Trade Development and Cultural Promotion

To provide a conducive environment for business operations, nurture talent and strengthen culture, the county government;

- Constructed the Makueni Produce Wholesale and Retail Market Shed, benefiting over 10,000 traders, through Kenya Devolution Support Program.
- Organized ward-level Music and Cultural Festival, showcasing music, dance, and cultural exhibitions, attracting over 194 entries and 1,022 participants from all six sub-counties.
