1.0 Introduction



The profile provides a detailed record of projects implemented in each ward, including budget allocations, locations, implementation status, and the resulting community impact.





No of Projects for FY2022/23, FY2023/24 and FY2024/25

2.0 Achievements



Water Access and Environmental Conservation

To enhance water access and reduce the distance to reliable water sources, the County Government implemented the following interventions;

- Solarized and distributed Kilia, Kithuni, and Ngitini boreholes providing reliable water access to approximately 1,800 households
- Solarized Mwitiko water project benefiting approximately 600 households.
- Desilted Masaani, Kyamyatu, Kwa Kikungu and Kwa Kikonde earth dam benefiting approximately 1,250 household.
- Planted 256,000 trees at Makongo and Kilala forests and neighbouring farms in partnership with World Resources Institute, promoting reforestation and environmental conservation.

Road Access and Connectivity

To improve road access and strengthen connectivity, the county government;

- Opened 64.2kms, graded 120 km and graveled 2 km of roads, improving access and connectivity across the ward.
- Installed drainage structures including 81 m of culverts, 13 gabions, 50 scour checks, and one drift, ensuring roads remained passable during the rainy season.
- Excavated 1,259 m³ of cut-off mitre drains through the Miradi Kwa Jamii Programme, creating job opportunities for 612 community members while transforming roads into climate-resilient infrastructure and supporting improved agricultural production.
- Connected 136 households in Mavia Meu/Ngiluni/Kawanine village with electricity through REREC matching grant, improving living standards and stimulating local economic activities.
- Installed 13 floodlights at Ngiluni, Makongo, Kithuni, Kivani, Kavandini, Mwea, Mavia Meu, Mulolongo, Nguluni, Kasunguni and Watema markets enhancing security, safety and extending trading hours.

Agricultural Production and Productivity

To enhance food security, improve farmer livelihoods, and promote sustainable agricultural practices, the county government;

- Vaccinated 8,993 livestock and poultry against pests and diseases, benefiting 2,485 farmers.
- Supported 2,013 farmers with 12,348 avocado seedlings, fertilizer and insecticides to cushion them against high farm input costs.
- Supported sisal and industrial crop development, benefiting 850 farmers.
- Promoted disruptive agricultural technologies, such as Soil sampling, climate smart agriculture among others to 8 cohorts, benefiting 6,500 farmers, supported the poultry value chain and assisted 169 mango farmers (6 CIGs) in FY 2022/23 and 332 mango farmers (13 CIGs) in FY 2023/24 under the NARIGP program.
- Formed Kee Ward-based SACCOs and provided seed capital of K.shs 1,000,000 to enable farmers access credit.



Urban Development

To promote sustainable land use and urban development, the county government:

- Established the Mbooni-Kee Municipality, enhancing urban governance and improving service delivery.
- Constructed Kola sanitation block, improving hygiene and public health services.
- Constructed Kola toilet block, improving sanitation within the market.



Health Services

To enhance access to healthcare, the county government:

- Distributed essential commodities and medical supplies to various health facilities.
- Renovated Kee Health Centre outpatient block. The facility serves a catchment population of 1,800, and a monthly workload of 340 patients.
- Supported 80 community health promoters in carrying out primary health care within the ward reaching out to over 5,000 households.
- Conducted outreach campaigns which include Non-Communicable Diseases (NCDs) and medical outreach within the ward promoting primary health care.

Access to Education

To enhance access to quality education and training, the county government;

- Constructed new classrooms for 5 ECDE centres (Nguluni, Kivaku, Kyandumbi Kasunguni and Kivai), enhancing conducive learning environment.
- Confirmed 23 ECDE teachers to permanent and pensionable terms ensuring consistent access to education and improved livelihood.
- Provided teaching and learning materials to 28 ECDE centres enhancing access to quality of early childhood education.
- Supported 1,008 bright and needy students with bursaries and awarded full scholarships to 6 new form one students enhancing retention and transition in learning institutions.
- Provided training tools to Mwea and Kee CTTIs to enhance practical skills training.

Social Protection and Youth Empowerment

To improve the well-being and livelihood of the vulnerable population, the county government;

- Supported 6 organized groups each with a 100-seater tent and chairs for rentals enhancing economic empowerment.
- Trained 44 beneficiaries on motor vehicle driving and issued with licences to secure driving related jobs.
- supported 22 persons with disabilities with assorted assistive mobility devices enhancing their self-reliance.
- Supported 112 elderly persons with food, non-food items and medical insurance subscriptions for healthcare access, benefiting 5.4% of the ward's elderly population of 2,092.
- Organized safe spaces forums benefitting 168 school going children to identify key protection concerns for targeted follow-up and intervention.
- Facilitated 36 ward teams to participate in Ligi Mashinani ward league games and provided sports items enhancing sports development at grassroot level.
- Mapped and assessed 266 persons with disabilities to enable them acquire certificates and access essential services.



Security of Land Tenure

To enhance access to justice and safeguard inheritance rights, the county government:

- Conducted a legal clinic and succession rights awareness campaign, benefitting 50 households and initiating succession petitions.



Governance

To strengthen coordination, citizen engagement, and overall service delivery, the government:

- Responded to two forest fire incidents through the Rapid Response Team, safeguarding nearby communities.
- Facilitated election of development committees at village, cluster, sub-ward and ward levels enhancing coordination and service delivery.
